

## PROJECT UPDATE: Sacramento County Public Health Naloxone Distribution Project

Sacramento County Public Health received a grant from the California Department of Public Health for 2,900 doses (1,450 2-dose kits) of naloxone nasal spray, an opioid overdose reversal drug, for distribution to local entities with naloxone distribution programs. Nine law enforcement agencies are participating in the project. Officers have access to naloxone in the field in the event that they encounter someone in the community experiencing an opioid overdose or experience an occupational exposure to opioids such as fentanyl. Each law enforcement agency submitted a training plan to and received approval from Sacramento County Emergency Medical Services prior to receiving their allocation from Public Health.

Two community-based organizations are also participating. Both agencies had existing programs that distribute injectable naloxone to opioid users through opioid overdose reversal training programs. They are focusing on family and friends of opioid users for nasal spray distribution. All 1,450 kits have been provided to participant agencies.
