

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What is a Spoke?

A spoke can be:

- ✓ Federally Qualified Health Center (such as One Community Health)
- ✓ Mental health center
- ✓ Private practice
- √ Community clinic
- Provide office-based opioid treatment and ongoing care for patients with more stable opioid use disorder.
- Can involve multidisciplinary staff, such as counselors and clinical case managers to coordinate the individual needs of each patient, although this is not always the case for those spokes with more limited staff resources.
- Can provide wraparound services to support recovery by addressing nontreatment needs such as transportation.



Benefits of Being a Spoke

Spokes receive a variety of support services from the Hub:

- > Technical assistance to develop program
- Mentorship for clinicians
- Ability to refer complex patients to Hub

Other possible support (depending on grant money) might include:

- Reimbursement for cost of medications for uninsured individuals
- ➤ Assistance with transportation for patients in form of bus passes



Background

- Psychiatry at One Community Health operated a small MAT program for the previous 8 years
- One Community Health was invited to join the CA Hub and Spoke system in October 2018.
- MOU was signed November 18, 2018 with CommuniCare organization
- One Community Health has 9 clinicians who are X-waivered to prescribe buprenorphine for opioid use disorder
- In 2019, established informal partnership with UC Davis ED and Mercy San Juan ED to accept referrals for individuals who have been started on buprenorphine for OUD in the ED, and who need to find medical home to continue MAT treatment.



Medications for Addiction Treatment (MAT) Services at One Community Health

- Assessment & diagnosis of an opioid use disorder
- Medications for Addiction Treatment
- Counseling
- HIV and HCV testing
- Case management
- Medical, social work, and mental health services
- Recovery & peer support
- Maternal addiction treatment
- Intensive outpatient treatment



Special Features of Our MAT Services

- "Open door policy" for new patients seeking MAT services.
 - Medi-cal and most insurances accepted
- On-site pharmacy for ordering medications for starting patients on the medications.
- Coordinated care with primary care, behavioral health, and case management
- In-house and professional referrals



MAT Program Development

- Ongoing Training for clinicians and ancillary staff
 - November 2018 to present, through Hub and Spoke system
 - November 2019 to June 2020 through Sierra Health Foundation grant
- Funding to implement and develop MAT program from HRSA SUD-MH grant in September 2018, and Sierra Health Foundation grant in July 2019
- MAT protocols, workflows and communications systems have been developed
