



Public Health Impact of Syringe Services Programs (SSPs)

- Reduce incidence of fatal overdose
 - Naloxone training and distribution
- Reduce transmission of infection and disease
 - Blood-borne viruses (HCV, HIV, etc.) via sterile injection and smoking supplies (and sometimes testing & linkage)
 - Sexually transmitted infections via safer sex supplies (condoms, lube, etc.)
 - Bacterial infections via distribution of hygiene supplies
- Facilitate better health decisions and outcomes
 - Smoking vs. injecting
 - Wound care and medical treatment
 - Linkage to services (food, shelter, treatment, mental and medical health care)
 - Reduction in unwanted pregnancy via safer sex supplies




Syringe Services Programs in California

Currently:

> 75+ SSPs in California

 Adding programs in more traditionally conservative areas

 Increased opposition as housing crisis/ visible homelessness in CA worsens



CDPH Provides California's SSPs with:

- Supplies via Harm Reduction
 Supply Clearinghouse
- Authorization for some programs
- Technical assistance
- Funds for staffing via California Overdose Prevention and Harm Reduction Initiative
